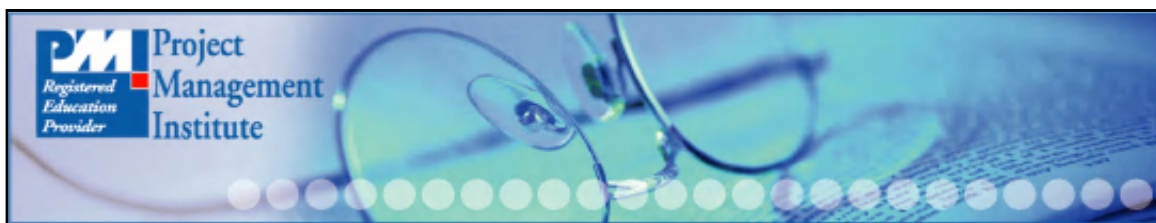

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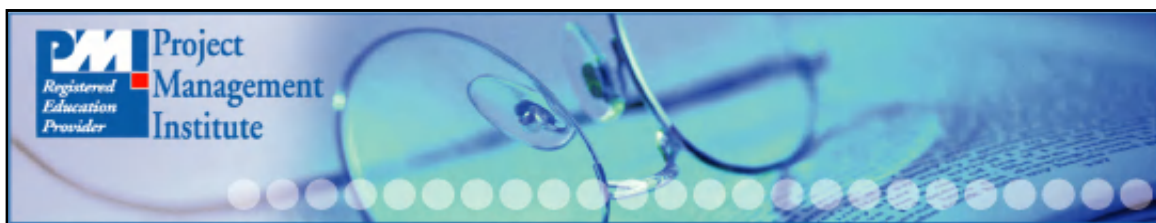




1 Program Value

3.5 PMI® Standards applied in this Program

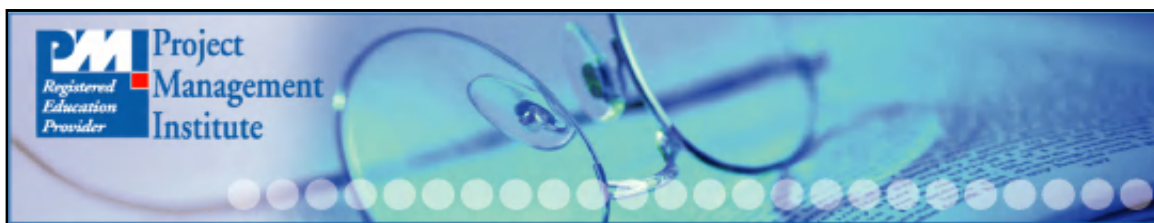

- **The Standard for Program Management** is the reference for program management from PMI®. Understanding of this standard is important for taking the PgMP® exam.
- **The Standard for Portfolio Management** is the reference for portfolio management. While the PgMP® focuses on program management, however, the portfolio management standard has important knowledge necessary for



program managers especially in the area of defining a program, which is part of the scope of the PgMP® exam.

- **Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge, fourth edition (PMBOK)** is the American National Standard Institute (ANSI) approved reference for project management. This standard is used to build the material in accordance to PMI's terminology and spirit in implementing project management
- **Project Management Competency Development Framework (PMCDF)** identifies the core elements of competency for project managers and provides key information on how to build these competencies. This valuable standard is used to ensure that competency development activities during the program cover the core competencies identified by this standard and follows effective practices in building these competencies.
- **Organizational Project Management Maturity Model (OPM3)** provides description of the core elements of organizational maturity in project management. 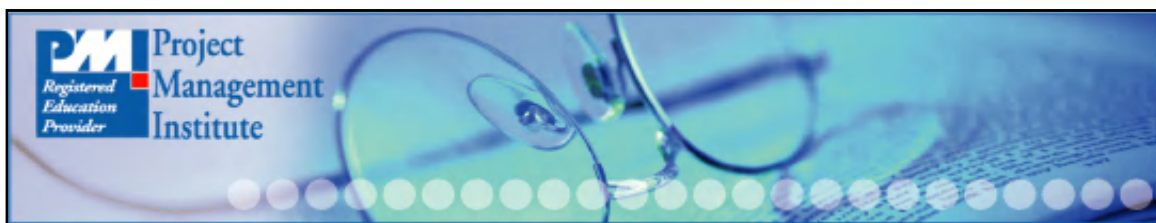

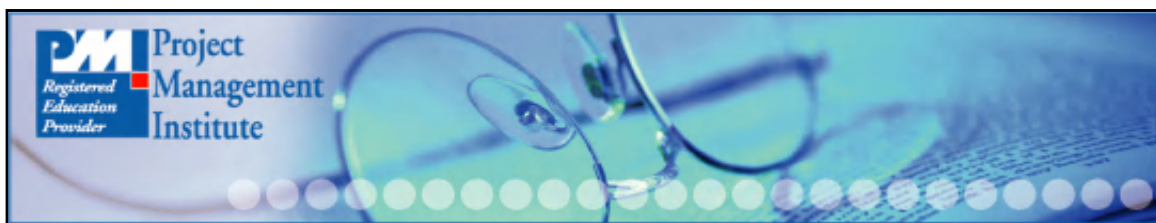

6.2 Venue

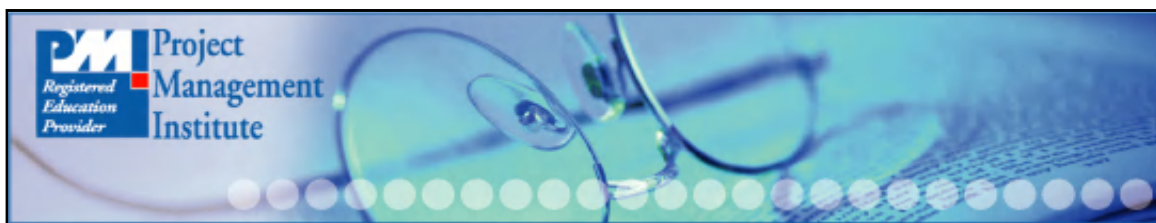
